


Key Questions

The worksheet contains 11 empty speech bubble shapes arranged in two columns. The left column has five bubbles, and the right column has five bubbles. Each bubble is a simple black outline with a pointed tail, intended for students to write their key questions.



Encourage pupils to think up their own interesting and open ended questions. This could be done with the whole class or in smaller groups.

Hand out some post-its to each small group, encourage the pupils to write as many questions as they want to find out about.

The questions then need to be sorted, they can rank them in order of those questions they are most interested in finding out about.

You could use this sheet to make a note of the class' most interesting questions.
